


March/April 2022

—Romans 12:1-2



Then as the disciples grieve his death and fear for their lives he appears to them in the Upper Room, Risen from the Dead.

This Lenten season, won't you join me on Wednesday nights and Sunday mornings in learning more about our Savior?



February 28—April 10 is the Minnesota FoodShare Food Drive. This is the time of year we ask for donations of food and money for the Sibley County FoodShare. In 2021 the food shelf provided for an average of 150 households per month. A total of over 6,000 people benefited from the food shelf and 175,000 pounds of food was distributed.

Every contribution of food or money received during the Minnesota FoodShare March Food Drive is counted, weighed and reported to the Minnesota FoodShare. They match a percentage of the total amount donated to give the food shelf even more resources.

Sibley County FoodShare is open Mondays from 2:00—6:00 p.m., Wednesdays 3:00—7:00 p.m. and the 1st Friday of each month 9:00—11:00 a.m. They are located at 111 Industrial Ave S, Gaylord, MN. The website is sibleycountyfoodshare.org, you can now donate online!. Mailing address is Sibley County FoodShare, PO Box 676, Gaylord, MN 55334.

Envelopes will be available at church if you wish to make a donation to the Sibley County FoodShare.
